Background

Parenting for Liberation (P4L) is cultivating resilient and joyful Black families that are doing the healing work to interrupt historical traumas, intergenerational violence and dismantle harmful narratives about the Black family. We are a small but mighty team of Black folks with a commitment to raising liberated and free Black children in community. P4L engages Black parents as active participants in interrupting violence, amplifying them as the powerful and political forces they are. Violence that begins in the home is a learned behavior passed from generation to generation. If violence can be learned, it can also be unlearned. P4L offers culturally-specific, concrete learning opportunities for Black Parents to grow their parenting skills, through our workshop series.

Job Description

We are looking to hire an Education Coordinator to coordinate and facilitate our parenting workshop series including “Trauma to Triumph” and our workshop series based on the book, *Parenting for Liberation: A Guide to Raising Black Children*. The Education Coordinator will help develop, deliver, and evaluate all aspects of our learning series. Candidates should be passionate about Black parents and Black families, be able to see their value and potential, and be prepared to lead them towards raising liberated Black children. We seek an individual with the ability to establish trusting relationships, build inclusive and affirming spaces, and support the growth and development of program participants through a healing justice and arts-based approach. This position requires the individual to work flexible hours, as workshops take place during evenings and weekends.

Core Responsibilities:

- **Workshop Facilitation:** Facilitating workshop series with various groups of Black parents including but not limited to: teen parents, pregnant parents, formerly incarcerated parents
- **Curriculum Development:** Revising, updating, and upgrading existing curriculum content, applying an intersectional and trauma-informed lens, and infusing creative and healing approaches
- **Communication:** Outreach and engagement with parent participants for recruitment, in between sessions, and for evaluation
- **Evaluation:** Maintaining attendance records of parent participants and implementation of evaluation tools to assess the effectiveness of workshops
- **Podcast:** Conduct outreach and draft learning questions for potential podcast guests, summarize key points into tools and resources for sharing on various P4L platforms, and maintain monthly podcast content calendar

Qualifications:

- Experience facilitating, supporting and guiding a diverse group adults in a group setting both virtually and in-person
- Holds an intersectional and trauma-informed lens in delivering liberated education and empowerment programs
- Understanding of the impacts of historical violence and ongoing systemic inequities on Black families; knowledge of how intersecting systems of racial, gender, and class discrimination shape current conditions for Black families
- Experience managing and facilitating in virtual spaces across multiple platforms such as Zoom, Google, etc.
- Proficient in Google Suite (Docs, Sheets, Slides, Forms, etc.)
- Demonstration of strong skills in written and verbal communication, building rapport, analysis and problem-solving.

Overall we're looking for someone who is:

- Committed to education and liberation
- Strategic with strong facilitation and communication skills.
- Collaborative and can build relationships with multiple stakeholders, such as parents, activists, organizers, and funders.
- Self-starter, self-managed, and detail-oriented and able to manage and hold multiple aspects of a project.
- Firmly holds values and passion for justice and equity, including familiarity with learning and unlearning, parenting styles, and racial and social justice movements.
